





History of Zgierz

- One of the oldest cities in the Łódź Province
- Zgierz got city rights before 1288
- 30.03.1821 conclusion of the Zgierz Agreement
- Zgierz was bombed at the beginning of II World War
- 20.03.1942 public execution of 100 Poles
- 17.01.1945 liberation of the city
- After the war Zgierz became industrial town



1898 - establishment of the 7th grade male School of Economics September 1939 - most of the school materials were burned by the Germans and Polish children were forbidden to study; secret teaching starts. March 1945 - resumption of education at school with not enough materials. 1950 - the first reunion of graduates, which continues to this day.


